External Sound Propagation: More Reasons to Mistrust Your Measurements

Strange things happen in the Collie Basin, WA. A recent study investigated variations in sound level from a constant source, over several nights, at distances between approximately 1 and 4 km. Simultaneous meteorological measurements were also conducted. Measured noise levels varied significantly over periods of minutes, hours and days, and variations were only weakly correlated with any measurable meteorological variables. It is apparent that micro-meteorological factors involving very small-scale changes in wind and temperature gradients have a significant effect on sound level at these distances.

Modelling packages ENM and SoundPlan (using CONCAWE prediction algorithms) were used to predict mean and percentile exceedance noise levels over the measurement period. Which model was best? You'll have to come to the seminar to find out.
